Dear Church Family,



JOY TO THE WORLD

from David Jeremiahs' The Book Of Signs.

Isaac Watts began writing poems when he was 7; and after his college years, began writing hymns. Isaac lived in a time when hymns were frowned upon, for many British believers only sang the Psalms in church. But Isaac wrote hymns anyway, and he is remembered today as the father of English hymnody. Many of his hymns are widely sung, including his great Christmas carol "Joy To The World". But Watts would be chagrined to know that "Joy To The World" is sung today as a Christmas carol, because he was not thinking of the birth of Christ when he wrote it, but of our Lord's return and the golden age that would follow the second coming. This hymn first appeared in a 1719 hymn book, in which Watts took many of the biblical Psalms and paraphrased them through the eyes of the New Testament. "Joy To The World" is based on his interpretation of Psalm 98 and the words do not refer to the birth of Christ at all. As you sing, let your mind's eye fast forward to the Lord's second coming, and consider: Did the things in this hymn happen when Jesus was born? Did the earth receive her King? Was nature transformed? Fields & floods, rocks, hills, & plains? Did thorns stop infesting the ground? Was the curse lifted? Did sin & sorrow cease, and does Christ currently rule the world with truth & grace? Do nations acknowledge His righteousness and wonder of His love? Let's think about the millennium & Christ's 1000 year reign as we sing.
